2030 Transportation Plan Community Workshop on Oct. 28

Douglas County will host its second community workshop on the 2030 Transportation Plan on Tuesday, Oct. 28 from 6 to 7:30 p.m. at the Douglas County Philip S. Miller Bldg., 100 Third St. in Castle Rock.

An open house will take place from 6 to 6:15 p.m. where citizens can review displays on roadways, transit and bicycles. At 6:15 p.m. a presentation on "How do the alternative transportation solutions meet future mobility needs?" is scheduled, followed by an open discussion from 6:45 to 7:30 p.m. Douglas County wants to receive feedback from citizens during this open discussion to help formulate the 2030 Transportation Plan. Attendees may also complete and return comment cards that will be available at the workshop. After the meeting a Douglas County representative will be available at each of the displays to answer any questions.

The 2030 Transportation Plan is a long-range vision for a multi-modal transportation system that offers choices in how people travel supported by a realistic plan to fund and implement improvements. A transportation network that is comprised of diverse types of transportation facilities supports improved access and mobility, shapes the way we travel, and the development of our communities. The integration of the transportation network and land use provides important benefits including: improved travel choices and options; reduction in road network demands, vehicle miles traveled and time spent driving; supports community health and active living; supports economic vitality; improved air quality; and conserves energy and natural resources.
